## Sports Physicals

As per the NSAA, each student who expects to participate in athletic contests shall present to the superintendent or principal once each year, before actual participation in any interschool sport, a physician's certificate on a form recommended by the NSAA that he/she is physically fit for athletic participation. A physical taken in the summer vacation period or anytime during the school year is good only to the end of the school year. Any physical taken May 1 or after will be considered a part of summer vacation. The Pre-Physical Evaluation Consent Form and the NSAA Student and Parent Consent Form will need to be provided to the school before students can participate in pre-season activities. All forms can be found on the NSAA website or available at the doctor's office. Sports physicals can be turned in to the school office.

## Kindergarten and Seventh Grade Forms Needed before August 14th

All students entering kindergarten are required to submit copies of the following forms to the school office before the first day of school, August 14th: physical, vision exam (can be done by doctor at physical appointment), birth certificate, and updated immunizations record.

All seventh grade students are required to submit copies of their updated immunization records before the first day of school, August 14th. All of these forms can be turned in anytime over the summer to the main office.

## Immunization Records

In an effort to keep our office records up to date we ask that whenever your child receives an immunization that you also give the office an updated immunization record. These can be brought to the office anytime you have a new record. We understand that the infant through toddler years are when most immunizations occur, we would still like a new record whenever you have one. Thank you for helping us keep our records up to date.

## Spanish News, by Mrs. Rytych

The Shickley High School Spanish 1 and 2 students took the 2019 National Spanish Exam, sponsored by the American Association of Teachers of Spanish and Portuguese. Attaining a medal or honorable mention for any student on the NSE is very prestigious, because these exams are the largest of their kind in the U.S. and contain Class A through D schools combined.

There were several Shickley students who received recognition for excellent performance. Madeline Kamler and Alyssa Nolt received Plata (Silver) awards. (With a 94%, Madeline was also within the first 4 top places in the state of Nebraska.) Isaac Kamler, Jackson Grote, and Jady Kleinschmidt received honorable mention in the Spanish 2 Category.

On June 9 four Shickley students joined 284 other musicians and vocalists on a 16-day tour of Europe playing and singing in seven countries at multiple town squares and cathedrals. The highlight of their musical tour was playing on the grounds of Windsor Castle.

On non-concert days, students visited places like Buckingham Palace, Tower of London, Eiffel Tower, the Matterhorn in Switzerland, and the Riolto Bridge and waterways in Venice. While in London, students enjoyed watching the production of *The Lion King*.

Students were given the opportunity to continue their trip to Greece for an extended tour. Kaylee Noel participated in the extended tour and visited landmarks like the Parthenon, Acropolis, Zeus' Temple, and the Olympic Stadium. She also visited the Greek Islands of Hydra, Poros and Aegina.

### Mrs. Erickson's Supply List for Preschool
