Supply Lists for 2018-2019 School Year

Mrs. Schultz's Supply List for Kindergarten

- * 2 packs (4 each) of Expo Dry Erase Markers. (They are more expensive, but they last longer. If you can find bullet tip markers, get those. They are easier for the kids to write with than chisel tip.)
- * 1 paint shirt
- * 1 water bottle with a lid

- * 1 large box of Kleenex
- * 1 container of Lysol Disinfecting Wipes
- * 1 backpack
- * 1 box of Ziplock bags Boys bring gallon size; Girls bring quart size.

Please bring these items to school with your child's name on them. Mrs. Schultz will provide items such as pencils, crayons, erasers, glue, and scissors.

Mrs. Nelson's Supply List for First Grade

After-School Program Preschool through Second Grade

Dear Parents/Guardians:

We are pleased to offer the After-School Program again this year as a service to the Shickley Public School's community. The enrollment forms necessary to participate are attached. Please take note of the updated information for this year. If you will be using the program during the first week of school, completed forms must be submitted on or before the first day of school, August 15th, 2018.

The After School Program is offered to grades preschool through second grade and operates from 3:30-5:30 P.M. on all regular school days, and from 2:30-5:30 P.M. on early out days. There is no after-school program when the school closes early due to inclement weather. The program cost is \$7.50 per day, and you will be billed monthly, with each billing period ending on the last week day of each month. Bills will be mailed out the 1st of every month.

The time spent at the after-school program will allow the students time to relax after the school day, have a healthy snack, and do their homework, as well as, participate in crafts and games. There will also be time for stories, outdoor gross motors (gym time) and centers (activities and games).

If you are interested in this program, please fill out the forms attached before the first day of school on August 15th, 2018.

Friday 4 Longhorns (Four Year Olds Only)

Dear Parents/Guardians:

We are pleased to offer Friday 4 Longhorns as a service to the Shickley Public School's community. Due to the growing preschool enrollment size, Friday 4 Longhorns will only be offered to students who are in their 2nd year of preschool, attending 4 days a week, all day. This service will be available 7:45 A.M.-3:30 P.M. The cost is \$27.00 a day. Please note, your student could also attend the after-school program from 3:30-5:30 P.M. The cost is \$7.50 per day. Parents will be billed monthly, from Shickley Public Schools.

A schedule has been designed to allow the students time to relax, have a healthy lunch and snack, participate in crafts, centers, and games, similar to the preschool schedule.

The enrollment forms necessary to participate are attached and must be turned in before school begins. Please take note of the updated information for this year. If you will be using the program during the first week of school, completed forms must be submitted on or before the first day of school, August 15th, 2018.
