2019 Track Season, by Coach Karen Washington-Oglesby

The 2019 track season was filled with outstanding performances and new records. The highlights of the boys' season came with two 2nd place finishes at both the Exeter-Milligan and Tom White Invites. Senior John Christensen battled back from a knee injury sustained during football and set a new school record in the shot put with a distance of 51'6." Junior Nolan Weber broke his own school record in the discus with a distance of 147'6."

Boy state qualifiers were John Christensen in the shot put and discus, Nolan Weber in the discus, and sophomore Aaron Mick in the pole vault. John placed 2nd in the shot put and 8th in the discus, Nolan placed 6th in the discus, and Aaron placed third in the pole vault. The boys' team had some other athletes just shy of qualifying for the state meet.

A highlight of the girls' season was a school record performance by sophomore Macy Kamler in the discus with a throw of 106'3." Another highlight was the performance of senior TaraLee Hudson at districts when she reclaimed her school record in the discus with a throw of 113'5" and qualified for state. TaraLee placed 10th at state. These 13 girls had impressive top 5 finishes at the following meets: Tom White 2nd place, Exeter-Milligan 4th place, and Heartland Invite 5th place. The team made a tremendous amount of improvement during the season.

I was very pleased with the season. Both teams were enthusiastic and they worked very hard. They were terrific competitors and a pleasure to work with.

Hastings Museum

The Shickley first and second grade students had a blast at the Hastings Museum! They learned about the sea monsters of Nebraska, watched a planetarium show called "The Little Star that Could," dug fossils, learned all about how Kool-Aid was invented, and watched a 3-D show called "Superpower Dogs." The children represented Shickley Public Schools well as they were respectful, polite, and listened attentively to the presenter.

In their second year, the boys' golf team had another year of improvement! Several players spent the off-season on the course continuing to play and improve. With four returning players and the addition of four new players, the team was well-rounded and challenged each other for the varsity positions. The team set a team goal to shoot under 450 as a team and they accomplished their goal at the first meet by shooting a 408.

Season highlights include: Osceola 2-man scramble - B team of Josiah & Nolan finished 1st; Fillmore Central meet - Caleb 13th; Red Cloud - Caleb 13th; Blue Hill Cyndi Peil Memorial Scramble - Sam & Nolan 3rd in flight C; CRC meet - Caleb (V) 3rd, Eli (JV) 3rd, Austin (JV) 5th; Districts at Indianhead (Grand Island) - Josh 9th and Caleb 10th to both qualify for the state meet at Lake Maloney Golf Course (North Platte).

Caleb and Josh competed in the State Boys Golf Tournament May 21-22. Day one was cancelled due to rain and the championship was a 18-hole event. Both boys finished tied for 63rd with a 104. They had a great time and enjoyed the experience.

Sports Physicals

As per the NSAA, each student who expects to participate in athletic contests shall present to the superintendent or principal once each year, before actual participation in any interschool sport, a physician's certificate on a form recommended by the NSAA that he/she is physically fit for athletic participation. A physical taken in the summer vacation period or anytime during the school year is good only to the end of the school year. Any physical taken May 1 or after will be considered a part of summer vacation. The Pre-Physical Evaluation Consent Form and the NSAA Student and Parent Consent Form will need to be provided to the school before students can participate in pre-season activities. All forms can be found on the NSAA website or available at the doctor's office. Sports physicals can be turned in to the school office.

Kindergarten and Seventh Grade Forms Needed before August 14th

All students entering kindergarten are required to submit copies of the following forms to the school office before the first day of school, August 14th: physical, vision exam (can be done by doctor at physical appointment), birth certificate, and updated immunizations record.

All seventh grade students are required to submit copies of their updated immunization records before the first day of school, August 14th.

All of these forms can be turned in anytime over the summer to the main office.

Crossroads Conference All-Conference Academic Team

The Crossroads Conference has announced its All-Conference Academic Team. Seventy-one seniors were recognized as Gold, Silver, or Bronze award winners based on their highest achieved ACT score by March 1st.

At our Celebration of Academic Success Assembly, we recognized students in grades 2-11 for their outstanding growth and ability on our MAPS Assessment. In all, over 80 students were recognized for their outstanding growth over the course of the year. This is earned by exceeding the normal growth in reading, math, science, and language usage expected throughout the school year on a national average. 42 students were recognized for exceeding the 81st percentile and 16 students have earned scores in the 95th or higher percentile on one or more subtests.

As you can see, we have so much to be proud of and thankful for. Let's continue to challenge and support each other to be our best! Enjoy your summer, stay safe, and we look forward to school resuming in the fall!
