The Grind with Mrs. Coffey

I hope you and yours are safe and healthy. The resemblance of summer is finally in the air and I am excited to see students and families at the pool, in the parks, and enjoying other activities such as baseball and softball.

Since March 4, 2020, I have been involved in Zoom meetings, teleconferences, and the researching of COVID-19 for two to ten hours each week. Superintendents and other district leaders, Education Service Units, the Nebraska Department of Education, the governor's office, and public health officials have worked together to create guidance for best practices to address the many challenges school districts across the nation are facing.

These hours of research, guidance, and discussions have assisted our district in making fall reopening plans. Before the formal document for SPS is released, please take a look at some highlights of the important work we have been doing in order to have students and staff back in the building for the 2020-2021 school year:

- The "Shickley Strategy for the Return to Fall" will act as a framework for students, families, and staff responding to COVID-19 and its impact on education and other opportunities at SPS during 2020-2021 school year
 - Phase-approach based on Risk Dial in order to be flexible and responsive to the changing environment based on guidance from public health officials
 - Clear communication for our students, families, staff, and patrons
 - SPS has been preparing for many different and realistic scenarios: traditional approach, eLearning, and a multitude of hybrid approaches

Traditional Approach – Shickley Public Schools will meet guidelines provided for the reopening of schools and local public health conditions with appropriate safety precautions being made, in order to have ALL students and staff in the building.

Hybrid Approaches – These approaches first focus on having ALL students in the building with a multitude of different precautions based on public health guidance. Remote learning could be utilized in conjunction with in-person teaching and learning. These different approaches would be based on the health precautions and guidance from public health officials in place, at the time decisions are rendered.

eLearning – Necessary in the event of an extended school closure. No students would report to their respective buildings. Public health officials, the commissioner, or governor may indicate school building closure mandates similar to what occurred beginning on March 18, 2020.

We want to make sure we are doing everything we can to provide a safe and healthy environment for ALL our students and staff. We understand there are some strong opinions for and against the wearing of masks. Public health officials continue to support masks as the most effective and inexpensive intervention against COVID-19 transmission.

To conclude, there are many unknowns for the 2020-2021 school year. Shickley Public Schools will continue to work with our local and state health officials to create a safe plan for our students and staff. We hope to share our "Shickley Strategy for the Return to Fall" by mid-to-late July.

Please see the below information regarding required documents for entering kindergarten in the fall. If you are new to the district, we would like to have enrollment information by June 30th, if possible.

You will need to bring **your child's official birth certificate (with raised seal) and an up-to-date immunization record to school**; we can then make copies to keep at school. State laws require that for your child to come to school, we must have a copy of their **official birth certificate (we cannot accept a copy from you; instead we must make the copy from the official form), updated immunization record, a current physical, and a vision exam**. Vision exams can be completed by your physician during the physical. Your physician will have a physical form to fill out. A **dental exam** is not required, however, it is recommended. **These documents must be turned in by the first day of school in August**. If you would like to turn them in once completed, feel free to drop them by the school throughout the summer.

Fillmore and Thayer County Clinics are both available and running for scheduled physicals and immunizations. York Urgent Care is able to do physicals, however, they do not administer immunizations. Each facility asks that you call ahead for a COVID-19 screening before arrival.

Note: If your child has a birth certificate on file with Mrs. Erickson, you should not need to bring a new copy, as she will just pass it along.

Incoming 7th and 9th Grade Students Need Immunization Records and Physicals

All incoming 7th grade students are required to submit copies of their up-to-date immunization records and have a physical before the first day of school. All incoming 9th graders that will be participating in sports have to have a pre-participation physical before the first day of practice. All of these can be turned in any time over the summer to the front office.

Non-Public Consultation Notice

On August 10th at 5:00 pm, a meeting conducted by Shickley Public Schools will take place in the Superintendent's office at Shickley Public Schools. The purpose of the meeting will be to provide an opportunity for parents who have parentally placed their child in an approved and/or accredited nonpublic school or exempt home school and representatives of nonpublic schools to participate in the development of a plan for providing special education services to children with disabilities who attend an approved and/or accredited nonpublic schools and exempt home schools which are within the Shickley Public School district for the 2020-2021 school year. Parents of a homeschooled child or a child attending a nonpublic school who has been or may be identified with a disability and attend an approved and/or accredited nonpublic school within the boundaries of Shickley Public Schools, are urged to attend.
