Non-Public Consultation Notice

On August 10th at 5:00 pm, a meeting conducted by Shickley Public Schools will take place in the Superintendent's office at Shickley Public Schools. The purpose of the meeting will be to provide an opportunity for parents who have parentally placed their child in an approved and/or accredited nonpublic school or exempt home school and representatives of nonpublic schools to participate in the development of a plan for providing special education services to children with disabilities who attend an approved and/or accredited nonpublic schools and exempt home schools which are within the Shickley Public School district for the 2020-2021 school year. Parents of a homeschooled child or a child attending a nonpublic school who has been or may be identified with a disability and attend an approved and/or accredited nonpublic school within the boundaries of Shickley Public Schools, are urged to attend. Incoming 7th and 9th Grade Students Need Immunization Records and Physicals

All incoming 7th grade students are required to submit copies of their up-to-date immunization records and have a physical <u>before</u> the first day of school. All incoming 9th graders that will be participating in sports have to have a preparticipation physical before the first day of practice. All of these can be turned in any time over the summer to the front office.

Parents of Incoming Kindergarten Students, by Mrs. Schultz

Please see the below information regarding required documents for entering kindergarten in the fall. If you are new to the district, we would like to have enrollment information by June 30th, if possible.

You will need to bring your child's official birth certificate (with raised seal) and an up-to-date immunization record to school; we can then make copies to keep at school. State laws require that for your child to come to school, we must have a copy of their official birth certificate (we cannot accept a copy from you; instead we must make the copy from the official form), updated immunization record, a current physical, and a vision exam. Vision exams can be completed by your physician during the physical. Your physician will have a physical form to fill out. A dental exam is not required, however, it is recommended. These documents must be turned in by the first day of school in August. If you would like to turn them in once completed, feel free to drop them by the school throughout the summer.

Fillmore and Thayer County Clinics are both available and running for scheduled physicals and immunizations. York Urgent Care is able to do physicals, however, they do not administer immunizations. Each facility asks that you call ahead for a COVID-19 screening before arrival.

Note: If your child has a birth certificate on file with Mrs. Erickson, you should not need to bring a new copy, as she will just pass it along.
