MAP Growth: Measure of Academic Progress

MAP Growth measures what students know and informs teachers what they are ready to learn next. MAP Growth is a personalized online assessment que that provides immediate feedback to students and staff. Reports generated by NWEA help the teachers teach, students learn, and administrators lead.

Percentile ranks indicate how well students perform in comparison to the specific norm group; by grade and subject. Each percentile rank indicates that the student score as well or better than the percent of students in the norm group. For example, a student scoring in the 85th percentile scored as well, or better than, 85% of all students in his or her norm group nationally. It also means that only 15% in the norm group exceeded the score.

Below you will see the percentage of 2019-2020 students by each grade and subject 3rd-10th that scored in the average, high average, and high when compared to same age and area national norms:

Did you Know?


- The seniors pictured above were the Fillmore County Mock Trial champions!

Financial Information


As a rural Nebraska school, you can see we depend heavily on our local receipts in order to continue to make a positive impact on our students and community. In order to increase cash reserves and sustain our district long-range, strategic planning process, the district tax asking increased \$471,928.47 above the average of the prior three years: \$3,257,363.53. Please note: the pie charts below have not been updated by NDE (updated charts should be available soon at https://nep.education.ne.gov) Shickley Public Schools continues to maintain having over approximately 70% of expenses going into student programming and approximately 80% of receipts coming from local sources.
