The 2020-2021 school year has been a unique one to say the least. We are clean, masked, and finally together on a daily basis. These are three joys that are celebrated daily. Math classes have found other ways to celebrate too. Fibonacci Day was celebrated on November 23rd. The famous Fibonacci Sequence is the series of numbers 1, 1, 2, 3, 5, 8, 13,... The individual math classes celebrate learning each day. Topics range from Products to Polynomials, Quadrilaterals to Concavity, and Trigonometry to Transformations. Students are on track for the ACT test and the NSCAS test.

The 5th-8th grade students have been diligently working on their in-class speeches that will be presented on March 31st, in their respective classrooms. The 5th graders will be giving informative speeches, the 6th graders will be giving persuasive speeches, the 7th graders will be giving entertainment speeches, and the 8th graders get to choose between the three modes. Each student chooses his/her own topic, researches information, writes the speech, and performs it in front of his/her peers. The speeches begin at 8:15 on March 31st and guests are welcome to attend the presentations.

The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) was administered to the sophomore class on February 26th. Even though this is the test required to join the military forces, it also has many benefits to non-military bound students. The test consists of questions that showcase student's strengths and aptitudes for different careers and fields of study. It is a great indicator of student's all-around strengths and weaknesses that will be utilized in their future employment endeavors.

During the second semester, the art and guidance departments have integrated multiple cross-curriculum lessons between the junior high 2D Art and 3rd grade classes. Ms. Nuss has been incorporating social and emotional learning (SEL) into the projects the 2D junior high art students have been completing. This meshes well with the SEL lessons the 3rd grade students have been learning from Mrs. Noel. This past month, the students completed an anxiety spiral piece where the kids cut out pictures of things that cause them anxiety.

From there, the student should be discussing with their parents their future plans, courses that would benefit their career pathway and finally determining a class schedule for next year. For those students wanting to take classes online or for dual credit, that information should be available in the near future. As a reminder, although online and dual credit classes are a great option for Shickley students, it is not a requirement for all students. Those that are taking online or dual credit classes need to be self-motivators, have high academic integrity, and the willingness to work hard. They need to realize that although the professors are there to help them, it is the student's responsibility to monitor and hold themselves accountable to complete assignments and meet deadlines. If there is any doubt, it would be suggested that the student not take an online course. The SPS schedule for secondary students is diverse and has many options for students who find success with face-to-face instruction.
