




Ozobots, by Ms. Hansel

Students in grades K-6 recently finished up their unit on Ozobots. Ozobots are tiny robots that students are able to program. Through our lessons, students were able to learn what makes an Ozobot work and the colors used to "code" them. We started off really simple, learning to draw basic lines the Ozobot could read, and then advanced to drawing color codes to make the tiny robot do tricks. A final project that all classes completed was one large track where students were able to show off the skills they learned to make the robot start, complete the commands, and make it to the finish line.

Science Fair Preparations Have Begun, by Mr. Elwonger

Science fair season is here, and the kids are hard at work preparing their projects. Throughout the year, students learn and practice scientific thinking and the processes that lead to discovery. To cap off the year, they put those skills into practice by asking their own question and developing an experimental method to collect their own data to provide an answer. It's a crucial learning experience in the science curriculum - it's a chance for students to do their own science.

The whole process begins with a question, and the students have asked some interesting questions this year. One group is trying to determine what kind of coffee mug keeps liquids warm for the longest period of time. Another is planting seeds in different types of soil to test which soil type is the best for growing that species of flower. If you want something a bit more gross, a group of seventh graders is testing which bottled drink grows mold the fastest. There's a huge variety of topics, so there's sure to be something that piques your interest.

The kids have put a huge amount of work into planning their projects. Over the coming weeks, we'll be performing our experiments, collecting data, and then drawing conclusions from that data. The students will then write a scientific report over their findings and putting together a board to present their findings to the public. Some of the details of science fair are still being worked on, but we'll provide more details in the daily announcements when it's available.
