## **FFA News**



BRONZE - Students scoring from the 75th through the 84th percentiles receive a Bronze medal.

HONOR - Students scoring at or above the 50th percentile (national average) through the 74th percentile are awarded an honorable mention.






# **Track Update**

# Elementary Guidance
