NOTICE OF DESTRUCTION OF SPECIAL EDUCATION INFORMATION AND RECORDS

All Special education records that have been maintained by the school district for more than 5 years after they were no longer needed, are now scheduled to be destroyed.

Individuals that had testing done to determine eligibility <u>or</u> received services from Special Education staff need to notify the school with their preference for the removal of these files.

Options include: 1. Parent/Student may request the school district to shred all personally identifiable information contained in the Special Education files of the individual

2. Parent/Student may request the school district turn over all personally identifiable information contained in the file to the individual.

Parent/student may contact the school to obtain a form indicating their preference for removal of these Special Education records from the school district's files.

If the school district has not been contacted or forms returned to the school by **August 15, 2021**, the school district assumes the right to shred all information of the individual contained in the Special Education file. *In accordance with Nebraska Department of Education: Rule 51 - 009.03 Retention and Destruction of Information and Records*

Lyle Wagers Award

The purpose of this award is to recognize a business, family, or individual that has been a significant partner supporting Shickley Public Schools. Lyle Wagers modeled this support through his commitment to the Longhorn students, staff, and teams. From Speech to playground duty, Lyle was willing to support and help out the school in any way he could.

Each year, staff members at the school nominate and vote on our public supporters; the business, family, or individual who receives the most votes becomes the Lyle Wagers Award recipient.

This year's award recipients have contributed many, many years of service to teaching, coaching, working and volunteering at Shickley Public Schools. In 1976, Gary Filipi became a teacher and head football coach at Shickley High School. He taught junior high health, physical education, and driver's ed, while serving as head football coach from 1976 to 2001, as well as head boys basketball, and head girls basketball throughout his tenure. These individuals were no strangers to state football playoffs, state basketball tournaments, or even a state girls basketball final that resulted in a state runner up. In 2001, Gary was honored through the Nebraska Coaching Association for 25 years of coaching, and after 38 years at Shickley Public School, retired from teaching in May of 2014. Last year, Gary's lucky pants could even be seen once again at Shickley, on stage when 2021 graduate, Raleigh Shipley, performed as "coach" in the Shickley One Act. Through all of these years, Gary's wife of 52 years, Judy, was by his side, and served as a strong Shickley supporter; even working many years and many jobs at Shickley Public Schools. Judy worked as a paraprofessional, in the kitchen, and even as a custodian. She served as a teacher's aide, completing tasks and running errands for teachers, and she was always a supporter of the Shickley Kids; attending many games and activities. This year, Judy even began subbing at Shickley Public Schools.

Just as Lyle Wagers modeled support through his commitment to the Longhorn students, staff, and teams, so has this year's Lyle Wagers award recipients. Congratulations to the 2021 Lyle Wagers Award recipients: Gary and Judy Filipi.


